Dear Mr. Phillip:

This is in further response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request dated December 29, 2009, to the Department of the Army, Freedom of Information/Privacy Act Division, for all documents pertaining to the microwave auditory effect, microwave hearing effect, Frey effect, artificial telepathy, and/or any device or weapon which uses and/or causes such effects; any research or programs involving disruption or nullification of any device or weapon which uses and/or causes such effects; use of any of the aforementioned device or weapons which uses and/or causes such effects in experiments (ongoing and completed) upon civilians of the United States of America; use of any of the aforementioned device or weapons which uses and/or causes such effects in experiments upon civilians of the United States of America residing in the state of Arizona between the years of 1964-2000, in the state of Florida between the years of 1989-2010; any device or weapons that uses and/or causes the RF auditory effect or disrupts or nullifies the RF auditory effect; any programs, research, experiments, weapons or devices that involve you as a test subject, ongoing and completed and supplements our letter of February 3, 2010.

Coordination has been completed with an element of our command and the records have been returned to this office for our review and direct response to you.

We have completed a mandatory declassification review in accordance with Executive Order (EO) 12958, as amended. As a result of our review, information has been sanitized as the information is currently and properly classified SECRET and CONFIDENTIAL according to Sections 1.2(a)(2), 1.2(a)(3), 1.4(c), 1.4(e) and 1.4(g) of EO 12958, as amended. This information is exempt from the public disclosure provisions of the FOIA pursuant to Title 5 U.S. Code 552(b)(1). The records are enclosed for your use. A brief explanation of the applicable sections follows:

Section 1.2(a)(2) of EO 12958, as amended, provides that information shall be classified SECRET if its unauthorized disclosure reasonably could be expected to cause serious damage to the national security.

Section 1.2(a)(3) of EO 12958, as amended, provides that information shall be classified CONFIDENTIAL if its unauthorized disclosure reasonably could be expected to cause damage to the national security.

Section 1.4(c) of EO 12958, as amended, provides that information pertaining to intelligence activities, intelligence sources or methods, and cryptologic information shall be considered for classification protection.
